Super 3-D Noah's Ark

Story

It's been a long journey for Noah and the gang aboard the ark. In just a few more days, Noah and his family will be on dry land once again. Unfortunately there is a whole zoo of restless animals who want off the ark more than Noah does. It is up to you to help Noah make the animals go to sleep by feeding them. It's a big ark with a lot of critters, and around every corner you'll find a new adventure.

Overview

Maneuver Noah through various sections of the ark calming the animals down with food. Along the way, you will find bandages to heal yourself, gather fruit for extra turns, acquire better food launchers that will feed the animals faster, and discover secret passages and levels!

Goal

Guide Noah to the staircase at the end of the level as quickly as you can. Along the way, help Noah feed as many animals, gather as much fruit and discover as many secrets as possible.

Starting the Game

At the title screen, press enter to go to the main menu. The menu has items you can choose by using the up and down arrows on your keyboard. After starting a game, you can return to the main menu at any time by pressing escape.

- **New Game** – Starts a new game.
- **Options** – Allows certain settings to be changed including controls, display, sound, and map.
- **Load Game** – If available, allows a previously saved game to be restored.
- **Save Game** – Allows the current game to be saved for later.
- **Read This!** – In game copy of the manual.
- **View Scores** – Shows the high scores table.
- **Back to Demo** – Returns to the title screen.
- **Quit** – Exits the game.

After starting a game, “View Scores” will be replaced with “End Game” which forfeits all remaining lives. “Back to Demo” will be replaced by “Back to Game” which closes the menu.

The Controls

The controls for the game can be changed in the controls menu that is part of the options menu. Refer to that menu for the most accurate information. The defaults are listed below:

- **W, A, S,** and **D** – Move Noah forwards, left, backwards, or right respectively.
- **Left/Right Arrows** or **Mouse** – Turn Noah in the respective direction.
- **Shift** – Change movement speed between running and walking.
- **Alt** – Allow strafing with the turn keys.
- **Up Arrow** or **Left Mouse** – Feed the animals
- **1-6** – Change feeding tool.
- **Esc** – Open main menu.

The Status Bar

Located on the bottom of the play screen, the status bar provides you with all of Noah's statistics. While playing the game, pay close attention to Noah's health and feed count. These numbers are the most important.

The game is divided into 6 main areas, each containing 3 to 6 sections.

The closer you are to the animals, the more health Noah loses.

Some doors are locked. Find the right key to open them.

Collect 50 fruits and earn Noah another chance to play!

At the end of every level, Noah will be rewarded for the number of animals he fed, how much fruit he collected, how many secret rooms he found, and how fast he finished.

This number represents the number of chances Noah has left before the game ends.

Normally, Noah can only hold 99 units of feed. Find the knapsack, and Noah will be able to carry around much more!

The Animals

Clean Animals

The Clean animals were used for food and are found throughout the ark. As Noah, you'll run into these troublemakers quite a bit.



- **Goat** – The goats are very quick and can only bother you by kicking at close range.



- **Sheep** – Sheep are relatively slow moving and easy to put to bed. Watch out for their spittle.



- **Antelope** – These guys are quick and their spittle packs quite a wallop! Avoid close contact.



- **Ostrich** – Don't let these colorful guys fool you. They're really cranky, fast, and smart.



- **Ox** – The meanest of the clean animals, the ox falls asleep somewhat easily but has strong spittle.

Unclean Animals

The unclean animals must be getting tired of their roommates, because they're pretty grouchy. Fortunately for Noah, there are only six to deal with. They appear in the last section of each area.



- **Carl the Camel** – The undisputed king of the spitting animals, Carl needs quite a bit of food before he'll take a nap. Remember, patience is a virtue.



- **Ginny the Giraffe** – She sounds like a friendly giraffe, but we all have our bad days... Look around for extra fod and bandages, you'll need 'em.



- **Kerry the Kangaroo** – Kerry's hopping mad and looking for food. Stock up with a strong feed launcher and plenty of feed and see if you can get her to settle down and take a nap.



- **Melvin the Monkey** – Get ready to dodge coconuts! Melvin expresses his anger a little differently than the rest of the animals. Just be patient and keep feeding him.



- **Ernie the Elephant** – Ernie's already got his trunk packed and he's looking for a way off the ark. Tucking him in won't be so easy... the only thing bigger than his ears is his appetite.



- **Burt the Bear** – When you first run into Burt, he'll be semi-hibernating behind a bush... sleepwalking if you will. Once he has enough feed, Burt will really wake up! Burt takes an enormous amount of feed before he'll nap... after all, he's been asleep for months. Good luck!

Psst Noah... Want some help?

The boss levels (the levels with the unclean animals) can be quite difficult. Before approaching the unclean animal, search very carefully for extra feed and bandages. Many times you will find better feed launchers if you search for secret rooms. Do this by “using” walls. Certain walls open up to secret rooms. Most of the time, but not always, the secret wall will look slightly different than the walls around it.

The Feed Launchers

To feed the animals so they'll fall asleep, Noah has a whole host of tools at his disposal. At the beginning of the game, Noah is only equipped with a small feed launcher. Bigger and better ones are found throughout the game.



- **Hand Feeding** – This is the most dangerous way to feed the animals. Noah only feeds by hand when he runs out of regular feed. Look at the bottom right corner of the status bar for Noah's feed count.



- **Small Feed Launcher** – Noah starts off with this feeder. It's pretty weak, but it beats feeding the animals by hand.



- **Large Feed Launcher** – Multiple animal feeding becomes a reality with this flinger. Hold down the feed button for rapid feeding.



- **Super Feeder 5000** – Noah really takes control of the ark with this baby. Be very careful when you're rapid feeding... the Super Feeder 5000 has a voracious appetite.

The Super Launchers

Hidden in the ark, Noah will eventually find the super launchers. There's no better way to feed a grouchy unclean animal than with one of these two.



- **Cantaloupe Feeder** – The weaker of the two super launchers, the cantaloupe feeder still serves up a powerful tasty meal no animal can resist.



- **Watermelon Feeder** – When you're out at sea it's important that everyone gets their allowance of vitamin C. What better way to supply it than with this, the mightiest of all feeders.

Psst Noah... Want some help?

Pressing 1-6 will change Noah's feeders, allowing you to select the appropriate one for the job at hand. These selections are only noticeable when Noah has the respective launcher.

The feed for the super launchers is different than the feed for the regular feed launchers. There are actual piles of cantaloupes and watermelons to use with these launchers. Noah's feed count relates to what launcher he is presently holding.

The Items

Health



- **Bread Crumbs** – Adds 4% health.



- **Small Bandage** – Adds 10% health.



- **Large Bandage** – Adds 25% health.

Feed



- **Small Feed Box** – Increases feed count by 5. Most animals leave this behind as scraps when they fall asleep.



- **Large Feed Box** – Increases feed count by 25.



- **Knapsack** – Allows Noah to carry more feed.



- **Cantaloupe Pile** – Adds cantaloupes to your stash.



- **Watermelon Pile** – Adds watermelons to your collection.

Miscellaneous



- **Fruit** – Collect 50 fruits and Noah earns another chance to play!



- **Keys** – Some levels have locked doors. Find the keys to unlock them.



- **One Up** – This gives Noah an extra chance to play and fills his health to 100%!



- **Map** – Collect this prize and open the map. You can now see the entire floor plan for the level, not just the areas you've been to. You can also see the whereabouts of all the items.



- **Quiz** – Answer a question about the story of the ark. Answer correctly and be rewarded by adding 25% health, 1,000 points, and 10 feed (25 feed if the health is not needed). If you don't, you'll still get to add 4% health.

Noah's Aid

- Save often! You can save the game at any time. Loading a saved game continues you where you left off.
- Look for hidden rooms on every level. Noah can find feeders, extra feed, fruit, and bandages. Just press the use button against a wall. If it's a secret wall, it will slide open.
- Somewhere in the ark are two secret exits which lead to secret levels. Search carefully, they are hidden well.
- Try to feed all the animals, find all the fruit and all the secrets. At the end of the level you will be greatly rewarded.
- When approaching a new room, open the door, run in and run back out again. This way the animals will see you and come to you through the door (makes it easier to feed 'em). Not only are they hungry, they're smart... they will open doors.



System Requirements

All systems are required to have at least 64MB of RAM and 10MB of free hard disk space. This game does not utilize hardware acceleration and will work with any video card.

At a minimum a Pentium 4 or equivalent CPU is recommended for Windows, Mac OS X (Intel), and Ubuntu. For Mac OS X (PowerPC) a G4 or later is recommended.

The following operating systems are supported:

- **Windows** 98, Me, 2000, XP, Vista, 7, 8, or 8.1
- **Mac OS X** 10.4-10.5 (PowerPC), 10.4-10.9 (Intel)
- **Ubuntu** 10.04 LTS, 12.04LTS, 12.10, 13.10, 14.04 LTS
 - Other Linux based operating systems are not officially supported, but most are compatible with Ubuntu.
- **Android** 3.1 Honeycomb or later.

The original **MS-DOS** version of the game is provided although it is no longer supported. It has less features and the system requirements for it are lower. For the DOS version, you need only 4MB of RAM and a 486 class CPU. An AdLib or Sound Blaster sound card is recommended.

Bible Quiz Guide

Scattered throughout some of the levels are quiz pickups. The pickups are usually placed such that they are optional, but there's little reason to avoid them. If you get the question wrong¹ you will be *given* four points of health. Get it right to get 25 points of health, 10 feed, and 1,000 points!

The questions will be displayed in sequential order, although which question is displayed first depends on the last play session.

1. Who was Noah's father?
“*Lamech* lived after he became the father of Noah five hundred ninety-five years, and became the father of other sons and daughters.” (Gen 5:30)
2. How old was Noah when he had Shem, Ham and Japheth?
“Noah was *five hundred years* old, then Noah became the father of Shem, Ham, and Japheth.” (Gen 5:32)
3. How many sons did Noah have?
“Noah became the father of *three* sons: Shem, Ham, and Japheth.” (Gen 6:10)
4. What kind of wood was the Ark made of?
“Make a ship of *gopher wood*. You shall make rooms in the ship, and shall seal it inside and outside with pitch.” (Gen 6:14)
5. How many cubits long was the Ark?
“This is how you shall make it. The length of the ship shall be *three hundred cubits*, its width fifty cubits, and its height thirty cubits.” (Gen 6:15)
6. How many windows did the Ark have?
“You shall make *a window* in the ship, and you shall finish it to a cubit upward. You shall set the door of the ship in its side. You shall make it with lower, second, and third levels.” (Gen 6:16)
7. How many doors did the Ark have?
“You shall make a window in the ship, and you shall finish it to a cubit upward. You shall set *the door* of the ship in its side. You shall make it with lower, second, and third levels.” (Gen 6:16)
8. How many stories did the Ark have?
“You shall make a window in the ship, and you shall finish it to a cubit upward. You shall set the door of the ship in its side. You shall make it with *lower, second, and third levels*.” (Gen 6:16)
9. How many of each kind of animal did Noah have on the Ark?
“Of every living thing of all flesh, *you shall bring two of every sort* into the ship, to keep them alive with you. They shall be male and female.” (Gen 6:19)

¹ The quiz can also be disabled in the DOS version of the game by launching the game with `noquestions`. When disabled, the pickups will give you four points of health just as if you got the question wrong.

10. How many of each clean animal did Noah have on the Ark?
“You shall take *seven pairs of every clean animal* with you, the male and his female. Of the animals that are not clean, take two, the male and his female.” (Gen 7:2)
11. How many days did it rain?
“In seven days, I will cause it to *rain on the earth for forty days* and forty nights. I will destroy every living thing that I have made from the surface of the ground.” (Gen 7:4)
12. How old was Noah when the floods came?
“Noah was *six hundred years old* when the flood of waters came on the earth.” (Gen 7:6)
13. How many days did Noah wait in the Ark for the floods to come?
“*After the seven days*, the floodwaters came on the earth.” (Gen 7:10)
14. The flood waters only came from the sky.
“In the six hundredth year of Noah’s life, in the second month, on the seventeenth day of the month, on the same day all *the fountains of the great deep were burst open*, and the sky’s windows were opened.” (Gen 7:11)
15. How many people were on the Ark?
“In the same day *Noah, and Shem, Ham, and Japheth*—the sons of Noah—and *Noah’s wife and the three wives of his sons* with them, entered into the ship” (Gen 7:13)
16. Noah collected the animals and put them in the Ark.
“Pairs from all flesh with the breath of life in them *went into the ship to Noah*.” (Gen 7:15)
17. Who survived the flood?
“Every living thing was destroyed that was on the surface of the ground, including man, livestock, creeping things, and birds of the sky. They were destroyed from the earth. *Only Noah was left, and those who were with him in the ship*.” (Gen 7:23)
18. How long did the flood last?
“The waters flooded the earth *one hundred fifty days*.” (Gen 7:4), “The waters continually receded from the earth. After the end of *one hundred fifty days* the waters decreased.” (Gen 8:3)
19. Which mountain did the Ark land on?
“The ship rested in the seventh month, on the seventeenth day of the month, on *Ararat’s mountains*.” (Gen 8:4)
20. What was the first animal to leave the Ark?
“*and he sent out a raven*. It went back and forth, until the waters were dried up from the earth.” (Gen 8:7)
21. What did the dove bring back to Noah?
“The dove came back to him at evening and, behold, in her mouth was a freshly plucked *olive branch*. So Noah knew that the waters were abated from the earth.” (Gen 8:11)

22. How many days did Noah stay in the Ark after the dove brought the branch?
“He waited *yet another seven days*, and sent out the dove; and she didn’t return to him anymore.” (Gen 8:12)
23. What was the first thing that Noah did after he got out of the Ark?
“*Noah built an altar to the Lord*, and took of every clean animal, and of every clean bird, and offered burnt offerings on the altar.” (Gen 8:20)
24. What is the sign that God gave us to show He would never flood the world again?
“When I bring a cloud over the earth, that *the rainbow will be seen* in the cloud, and I will remember my covenant, which is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh, and the waters will no more become a flood to destroy all flesh.” (Gen 9:14-15)
25. How old was Noah when he died?
“All the days of Noah were *nine hundred fifty years*, and then he died.” (Gen 9:29)
26. Who closed the door of the Ark when the floods came?
“Those who went in, went in male and female of all flesh, as God commanded him; then *the Lord shut him in*.” (Gen 7:16)
27. Why did God have the floods come?
“God saw the earth, and saw that it was corrupt, for *all flesh had corrupted their way* on the earth. God said to Noah, 'I will bring an end to all flesh, for the earth is filled with violence through them. Behold, I will destroy them and the earth.’” (Gen 6:12-13)
28. Noah was the only man to find grace in the eyes of the Lord.
“But Noah found *favor in the Lord's eyes*.” (Gen 6:8), “The earth was corrupt before God, and the earth was filled with violence. God saw the earth, and saw that it was corrupt, for all flesh had corrupted their way on the earth.” (Gen 6:11-12)
29. How many years did God say He would strive with man?
“The Lord said, 'My Spirit will not strive with man forever, because he also is flesh; so his days will be *one hundred twenty years*.’” (Gen 6:3)
30. What did Noah do after the flood?
“Noah began to be a farmer, and *planted a vineyard*.” (Gen 9:20)
31. Who was Noah's oldest son?
“Children were also born to Shem, the father of all the children of Eber, the *elder brother of Japheth*.” (Gen 10:21)
32. On which side did God tell Noah to pitch the Ark?
“Make a ship of gopher wood. You shall make rooms in the ship, and shall seal it *inside and outside with pitch*.” (Gen 6:14)

33. How wide was the Ark?

“This is how you shall make it. The length of the ship shall be three hundred cubits, *its width fifty cubits*, and its height thirty cubits.” (Gen 6:15)

34. How tall was the Ark?

“This is how you shall make it. The length of the ship shall be three hundred cubits, its width fifty cubits, and *its height thirty cubits*.” (Gen 6:15)

35. What did God make with Noah, so that Noah knew that he would be safe?

“*But I will establish my covenant with you*. You shall come into the ship, you, your sons, your wife, and your sons’ wives with you.” (Gen 6:18)

“But I will establish my covenant with you. You shall come into the ship, you, your sons, your wife, and your sons’ wives with you. Of every living thing of all flesh, you shall bring two of every sort into the ship, to keep them alive with you. They shall be male and female. Of the birds after their kind, of the livestock after their kind, of every creeping thing of the ground after its kind, two of every sort will come to you, to keep them alive. *Take with you some of all food that is eaten, and gather it to yourself; and it will be for food for you, and for them*.” (Gen 6:18-21)

“The Lord said to Noah, “Come with all of your household into the ship, *for I have seen your righteousness* before me in this generation.” (Gen 7:1)

38. Noah entered the Ark early to prepare for his family.

“*In the same day* Noah, and Shem, Ham, and Japheth—the sons of Noah—and Noah’s wife and the three wives of his sons with them, entered into the ship” (Gen 7:13)

39. How did God make the floods go away?

“God remembered Noah, all the animals, and all the livestock that were with him in the ship; and *God made a wind to pass over the earth*. The waters subsided.” (Gen 8:1)

40. How many months did Noah wait in the Ark after it came to rest on Mt. Ararat?

“The ship rested in the *seventh month, on the seventeenth day of the month*, on Ararat’s mountains. The waters receded continually until the tenth month. In the tenth month, on the first day of the month, the tops of the mountains were visible.

...

In the six hundred first year, in the first month, the first day of the month, the waters were dried up from the earth. Noah removed the covering of the ship, and looked. He saw that the surface of the ground was dried. In the *second month, on the twenty-seventh day of the month*, the earth was dry.” (Gen 8:4-14) Put simply: about 7.5 months.

41. Who was the first man off of the Ark?

“*Noah went out*, with his sons, his wife, and his sons’ wives with him.” (Gen 8:18)

42. What did Noah offer to God as thanks for keeping him safe?
“Noah built an altar to the Lord, and *took of every clean animal, and of every clean bird, and offered burnt offerings* on the altar.” (Gen 8:20)
43. What did God promise never to do again?
“I will establish my covenant with you: All flesh will not be cut off any more by the waters of the flood. *There will never again be a flood to destroy the earth.*” (Gen 9:11)
44. In what book of the Bible do you find the story of Noah?
Genesis
45. Which of Noah's ancestors lived to be 969 years old?
“All the days of *Methuselah* were nine hundred sixty-nine years, then he died.” (Gen 5:27)
46. Noah is mentioned at least 3 times in the New Testament.
“By faith, Noah, being warned about things not yet seen, moved with godly fear, prepared a ship for the saving of his house, through which he condemned the world, and became heir of the righteousness which is according to faith.” (Heb 11:7), “who before were disobedient, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, while the ship was being built. In it, few, that is, eight souls, were saved through water.” (1 Pet 3:20), “and didn’t spare the ancient world, but preserved Noah with seven others, a preacher of righteousness, when he brought a flood on the world of the ungodly;” (2 Pet 2:5)
47. Which of Noah's descendants was called 'mighty upon the earth'?
“Cush became the father of *Nimrod*. *He began to be a mighty one in the earth.*” (1 Chr 1:10)
48. Which of Noah's ancestors never died?
“*Enoch walked with God*, and he was not found, for God took him.” (Gen 5:24)
49. Noah is a descendent of which of Adam's sons?
“...the son of Noah, the son of Lamech, the son of Methuselah, the son of Enoch, the son of Jared, the son of Mahalaleel, the son of Cainan, the son of Enos, the *son of Seth*, the son of Adam, the son of God.” (Luke 3:36-38) The entirety of Genesis 5 also works.
50. Why is Noah mentioned in Hebrews 11?
“By faith, Noah, being warned about things not yet seen, moved with godly fear, prepared a ship for the saving of his house, through which he condemned the world, and became heir of the righteousness which is *according to faith.*” (Heb 11:7)
51. Noah took his wife, sons, and daughters into the Ark.
“Noah went into the ship with his sons, his wife, and his sons’ wives, because of the floodwaters.” (Gen 7:7) No daughters.

52. The flood waters came from the fountains of the deep and windows of heaven.
“In the six hundredth year of Noah’s life, in the second month, on the seventeenth day of the month, on the same day all the *fountains of the great deep were burst open, and the sky’s windows were opened.*” (Gen 7:11), “*The deep’s fountains and the sky’s windows were also stopped, and the rain from the sky was restrained.*” (Gen 8:2)
53. What is a covenant?
The covenant is a contract or agreement.
54. What title is Noah given in 2 Peter 2:5?
“and didn’t spare the ancient world, but preserved Noah with seven others, a *preacher of righteousness*, when he brought a flood on the world of the ungodly;” (2 Pet 2:5)
55. The Gospels liken the time before the flood to the time before:
“As the days of Noah were, so will be the *coming of the Son of Man*. For as in those days which were before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day that Noah entered into the ship,” (Matt 24:37-38), “As it was in the days of Noah, even so will it be also in the *days of the Son of Man*. They ate, they drank, they married, they were given in marriage, until the day that Noah entered into the ship, and the flood came, and destroyed them all.” (Luke 17:26-27)
56. By the time of Noah, how did God feel about having created man?
“The Lord was sorry that he had made man on the earth, and *it grieved him in his heart.*” (Gen 6:6)
57. Jesus is a descendant of Noah.
“Jesus himself, when he began to teach, was about thirty years old, being the *son (as was supposed) of Joseph, ... the son of Shem, the son of Noah*, the son of Lamech ... the son of Seth, the son of Adam, the son of God.” (Luke 3:23-38)
58. What kind of creatures were NOT mentioned as destroyed in the flood?
“All flesh died that moved on the earth, *including birds, livestock, animals, every creeping thing that creeps on the earth, and every man. All on the dry land, in whose nostrils was the breath of the spirit of life, died.*” (Gen 7:21-22) No sea creatures.
59. By how much did the water cover the mountain-tops?
“The waters rose *fifteen cubits higher*, and the mountains were covered.” (Gen 7:20)
60. What day of the seventh month did the Ark come to rest on Ararat?
“The ship rested in the seventh month, *on the seventeenth day of the month*, on Ararat’s mountains.” (Gen 8:4)
61. What was Noah commanded not to eat?
“But flesh with its life, that is, its *blood*, you shall not eat.” (Gen 9:4)

62. After the flood, what were the animals supposed to do?
“*Be fruitful and multiply. Increase abundantly in the earth, and multiply in it.*” (Gen 8:7)
63. With whom did God make His covenant?
“God spoke to Noah and to his sons with him, saying, 'As for me, behold, *I establish my covenant with you, and with your offspring after you, and with every living creature* that is with you: the birds, the livestock, and every animal of the earth with you, of all that go out of the ship, even every animal of the earth.'” (Gen 9:8-10)
64. Who was the father of the Canaanites?
“*Ham, the father of Canaan*, saw the nakedness of his father, and told his two brothers outside.” (Gen 9:22)
65. Abraham is a descendent of which son of Noah?
“*Abraham, the son of Terah, ... the son of Shem*, the son of Noah” (Luke 3:34-36) The answer can also be found in Genesis 11:10-27.
66. Which of Noah's descendants did he curse?
“He said, '*Canaan is cursed.*'” (Gen 9:25)
67. Why did Shem and Japheth cover up Noah with a garment?
“Shem and Japheth took a garment, and laid it on both their shoulders, went in backwards, and *covered the nakedness of their father*. Their faces were backwards, and they didn't see their father's nakedness.” (Gen 9:23)
68. The rainbow is a symbol that God will never judge mankind again.
“I set my rainbow in the cloud, and it will be a sign of a covenant between me and the earth. When I bring a cloud over the earth, that the rainbow will be seen in the cloud, and I will remember my covenant, which is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh, and *the waters will no more become a flood to destroy all flesh.*” (Gen 9:13-15)
69. God promised that Noah and the animals would get along.
“*The fear of you and the dread of you will be on every animal of the earth, and on every bird of the sky*. Everything that moves along the ground, and all the fish of the sea, are delivered into your hand.” (Gen 9:2)
70. Man did not eat meat before the flood.
“Every moving thing that lives will be food for you. *As I gave you the green herb*, I have given everything to you.” (Gen 9:3)
71. What did God say would happen to the man who commits murder?
“Whoever sheds man's blood, *his blood will be shed by man*, for God made man in his own image.” (Gen 9:6)
72. Everyone on the Ark survived the flood.
“*Noah went out, with his sons, his wife, and his sons' wives with him.*” (Gen 8:18)

73. How long did it take the water to recede so that the Ark could rest on Mount Ararat?
“The waters continually receded from the earth. *After the end of one hundred fifty days the waters decreased.*” (Gen 8:3)
74. After the flood, God destroyed the Ark.
There is no hint for this statement since it is false.
75. Noah had to gather and store food to eat during the flood for:
“Take with you some of all food that is eaten, and gather it to yourself; *and it will be for food for you, and for them*” (Gen 6:21)
76. The Bible says that Noah's wife was named Sarah.
There is no hint for this statement since it is false.
77. After the flood, Noah did not have any more sons.
“*These three were the sons of Noah*, and from these, the whole earth was populated.” (Gen 9:19) Noah's three sons were on the ark.
78. How many years did God give mankind to repent before the flood?
“The Lord said, 'My Spirit will not strive with man forever, because he also is flesh; so his days will be *one hundred twenty years.*'” (Gen 6:3)
79. Which person lived before Noah?
“This is the book of the generations of *Adam*. In the day that God created man, he made him in God's likeness.” (Gen 5:1)
80. Which person lived after Noah?
“The man knew Eve his wife. *She conceived, and gave birth to Cain*, and said, 'I have gotten a man with the Lord's help.'” (Gen 4:1), “...*Noah, the son of Lamech, the son of Methuselah...*” (Luke 3:36-37) *Joshua lived around the time of Moses.*
81. Noah did everything that God told him to do.
“Thus Noah did. *He did all that God commanded him.*” (Gen 6:22)
82. After Noah, with whom did God make His next covenant?
“*In that day the Lord made a covenant with Abram*, saying, 'I have given this land to your offspring’” (Gen 15:18)
83. What kind of covenant did God make with Noah?
“I will establish my covenant with you: All flesh will not be cut off any more by the waters of the flood. *There will never again* be a flood to destroy the earth.” (Gen 9:11)
84. People did not eat vegetables before the flood.
“Every moving thing that lives will be food for you. *As I gave you the green herb*, I have given everything to you. *But flesh with its life, that is, its blood, you shall not eat.*” (Gen 9:3-4)

85. In the covenant, God said that seed time and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, and what else would not cease?
“While the earth remains, seed time and harvest, and cold and heat, and summer and winter, *and day and night will not cease.*” (Gen 8:22)
86. God told Noah to make windows for all of the animals.
“You shall make *a window* in the ship, and you shall finish it to a cubit upward. You shall set the door of the ship in its side. You shall make it with lower, second, and third levels.” (Gen 6:16)
87. Rainbows existed before the flood.
“God said, 'This is the token of the covenant which I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for perpetual generations: *I set my rainbow in the cloud, and it will be a sign of a covenant between me and the earth.* When I bring a cloud over the earth, that the rainbow will be seen in the cloud, and I will remember my covenant, which is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh, and the waters will no more become a flood to destroy all flesh. The rainbow will be in the cloud. I will look at it, that I may remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is on the earth.' God said to Noah, '*This is the token of the covenant which I have established between me and all flesh that is on the earth.*'” (Gen 9:12-17)
88. About how long is a cubit?
A cubit is based roughly on the length from finger tip to elbow of a Man's arm. *About 18 inches.*
89. It took Noah 40 days to find two of every animal to put inside the Ark.
“Clean animals, unclean animals, birds, and everything that creeps on the ground went by pairs to Noah into the ship, male and female, as God commanded Noah. *After the seven days,* the floodwaters came on the earth.” (Gen 7:8-10)
90. On what day of the month did Noah look out of the Ark and see dry land?
“In the six hundred first year, in the first month, *the first day of the month,* the waters were dried up from the earth. Noah removed the covering of the ship, and looked. He saw that the surface of the ground was dried.” (Gen 8:13)
91. In Noah's curse he said Canaan would be a slave to his brethren?
“He said, 'Canaan is cursed. *He will be a servant of servants to his brothers.*'” (Gen 9:25)
92. How many years did Noah live after the flood?
“*Noah lived three hundred fifty years* after the flood.” (Gen 9:28)
93. Which of Noah's sons was a tattle-tale?
“*Ham,* the father of Canaan, saw the nakedness of his father, and told his two brothers outside.” (Gen 9:22)

94. What did Noah plant after the flood?

“Noah began to be a farmer, and *planted a vineyard.*” (Gen 9:20)

95. How did God communicate to Noah?

“*God said to Noah, 'I will bring an end to all flesh, for the earth is filled with violence through them. Behold, I will destroy them and the earth.'*” (Gen 6:13)

96. The Ark was built with sails so God could move it.

There is no hint for this statement since it is false.

97. A male and female of each animal was brought on to the Ark.

“Of every living thing of all flesh, you shall bring two of every sort into the ship, to keep them alive with you. *They shall be male and female.*” (Gen 6:19)

98. How many times did Noah send the dove out of the Ark?

“He himself *sent out a dove* to see if the waters were abated from the surface of the ground, but the dove found no place to rest her foot, and she returned into the ship to him, for the waters were on the surface of the whole earth. He put out his hand, and took her, and brought her to him into the ship. He waited yet another seven days; and *again he sent the dove out of the ship.* The dove came back to him at evening and, behold, in her mouth was a freshly plucked olive leaf. So Noah knew that the waters were abated from the earth. He waited yet another seven days, and *sent out the dove; and she didn't return to him anymore.*” (Gen 8:8-12)

99. How old was Lamech when he had Noah?

“*Lamech lived one hundred eighty-two years, then became the father of a son.*” (Gen 5:28)
